## Structuring Your Restorative Nursing Program-2

## **Restorative Nursing Documentation - Select Rehab**

To avoid further ROM loss and prevent the development of contractures, the restorative nursing manager developed instructions for providing passive range-of-motion exercises to his right arm, wrist, and hand three times per day for 90 days. The nurse aides have been instructed in how to do the passive ROM exercises.

According to the State Operations Manual, restorative nursing is important for maintaining the “highest practical physical, mental, and psychosocial well-being” for patients. Facility leaders should consider how a comprehensive restorative nursing program can help them reach these goals, given that such a program can maintain or improve a resident’s function, improve quality outcomes, ensure regulatory compliance and reduce costs.

The risk for ADL decline in long-term care residents is a serious issue that often leads to falls, pressure ulcers, weight loss, depression, and other negative outcomes. To ensure quality outcomes and to comply with federal regulation, nursing facilities must have a comprehensive and effective restorative program that encourages each resident’s highest level of function.

## **PDPM Restorative Nursing ~ Why All the Buzz? NHCA Sept 25 ...**

The intent of an RNP is to promote the residents ability to adapt and adjust to living as independently and safely as possible. Residents who are on an RNP must have a restorative need. In other words, a resident who is independent in ADLs usually would not be a candidate for an RNP. RNP's teach the resident to be as independent as possible and prevent declines in function.

## **Restorative Nursing Assistant | ARN**

Assure input regarding the restorative needs of residents is provided at the resident care plan meeting. Serve as resource for other facility staff involved in the provision of restorative services (e.g., activities). Coordinate in-service efforts for restorative nursing and general nursing with staff development designee.
